

LESSON PREP: Copy Roman Numeral cards, matching front and backs and printing double sided. Cut out the printed back-to-back cards for placing about the space.

MATERIALS:

- Roman Numeral Cards

Group students into pairs or trios.

Scatter the Roman Numeral cards around the room, gym, cafeteria, or playground. The Roman numeral side should be face up (the next clue is on the back of the card).

There are multiple cards for each answer. If you have 5 groups of students, spread out 5 of each card that has the correct answer. Only lay out 1 of each “oops” card.

The object of the game is to collect all of the correct scavenger hunt cards.

All the students are given the Roman Numeral key and the first clue. They then go around the room finding the answers to the clue.

The first team back with all 20 cards is the winner.

Write the key on the board:

I =1	V=5	X=10	L=50
C=100	D=500	M=1000	

Teacher states the first clue to get everyone started, “Look for the Roman numeral that represents 5.”
