

# Multiplication Chart Race

CCSS 3.OA.7

Create a large multiplication chart on the board, such as the example below. It need not be the multiplication chart from 1 to 10; the teacher can choose sections such as 5 to 9 or 3 to 7.

Do this activity as a timed race or as a team race and make two charts.

The students are to race to the board and fill in one square on the chart; the next student enters another product or corrects a previous product. Students continue to race until all numbers are filled in; the first team to correctly complete the chart is declared the winner.

## MATERIALS:

- White board markers

**NOTE:** To avoid one team seeing the answer of another team, use the same factors, but in a different order.
