Three years ago, when Zeno launched our strategic plan, we had a desire to deepen our impact in the family math space and build the math movement. Our commitment: to engage in partnerships to surface, amplify, and promote the truth that children and families of color are doers and lovers of math. Because we know math is a foundational skill in every culture and community across the planet, we were excited to explore how to resource and collaborate across other math missions.

In 2023 early learners and their families came together to play and build math identities rooted in positive learning experiences with one another and their peers. Your donations and volunteerism helped deepen partnerships in Washington State with 36 community organizations, expand our work to Illinois, Massachusetts, and Arizona state, as well as collaborate on a math initiative with 1 out of country partner. You brought love of math to 4,300 children across these communities, thank you!

So much has evolved in Zeno's work over 20 years: including an updated mission and vision, the adoption of a hybrid model of service delivery, a refined approach to collaborating with partners and centering the needs of the families reached, as well as expansion beyond Washington State. 




Math is Expansion

Math is Partnership

Seattle Universal Math Museum (SUMM)

Washington | Zeno partner since 2023

SUMM and Zeno have math missions focused on engaging children and the community around them in hands-on play to promote learning that sparks an interest in math that endures for a lifetime. Deepening our work in Washington State, this collaboration hosted a series of 20 family math engagement events reaching nearly 1,000 families.

Washington Department of Children Youth, and Families (DCYF) Statewide Zeno Essentials Cohort

Washington | Zeno partner since 2022

DCYF contracted with Zeno to create a training series for childcare providers across the state. The training series collaborated to increase the understanding of the role of race and racial equity and its connection to social emotional learning, early literacy, and early math identity development. This series was offered in English and Spanish, and offered 10 hours of STARS hours to childcare providers.

Sprig Holistic Math Assessment Initiative

Ontario, Canada | Zeno partner since 2023

Sprig Learning partnered with Zeno to reimagine early learning assessments for three to five year olds in pre-K to be more equitable for all educators, children, and families.

MathTalk

Massachusetts | Zeno partner since 2022

MathTalk, and Zeno piloted a program in Cambridge, Massachusetts. This partnership brought their augmented reality measurement app, Measure Everything, to Zeno game, Measure Me.



MathTalk creates unique opportunities for young children and their families, particularly those in economically distressed communities, to discover and enjoy math anywhere. Go on a backyard adventure with Omo, Johari, and Kamara to see the Measure! Everything! app by MathTalk in action.











Math is Partnership

José Martí Child Development Center

Washington | Zeno partner since 2019

Over the last three years, 80% of respondents reported they more frequently play and engage with early learners in math games and ideas and 90% more frequently integrate math into everyday interactions with early learners after participating in Zeno programs.

Encompass NW ParentChild+

Washington | Zeno partner since 2018

Over the last three years twice as many respondents strongly agree they are comfortable teaching math to children ages 3-5 after participating in Zeno programs.

It Takes a Village

Illinois | Zeno partner since 2022

It Takes a Village is a Chicago based collective of schools and teachers serving mostly families of color. This Family Mathways partnership included in person Professional Leanings, games for their classrooms, and coaching to integrate math into their Family community nights. In its first year this partnership reached 285 families and 66 educators.

Pima County Library System Workshop

Arizona | Zeno partner in 2022

The Pima County libraries is located in Tuscan Arizona. In an effort to support STEM learning, Pima County connected with Zeno about partnership. Together, we created a series of professional learnings opportunities to enhance classroom STEM experiences, increase family engagement, and support early learning educators across their region.
